




Possible Site for Solar Field

SOLAR POSSIBILITIES

- TBD Kuna Mora Road is in close proximity to several solar farms.
- ⇒ Solar One Project located near Kuna, ID, is one of the largest Solar Farms in the northwest. This is a 40 megawatt project that covers 563 acres and includes over 174,000 solar panels. It generates electricity for the Idaho Power Grid.
- ⇒ ID Solar Project 54.6 megawatt project is one of the largest solar installations in Idaho and was completed in 2016
- ⇒ Pleasant Valley Solar This project is expected to be operational in late 2025 and will power Meta's data center in Kuna. This project will be the largest solar facility in Idaho.
- ⇒ There is also a large Solar Farm in Mountain Home, Idaho which is located in Elmore County and is approximately 30 minutes form TBD Kuna Mora Road.

The 313.81 acres located on Kuna Mora Road is located in Ada County. It's location is a prime area for Solar and Wind projects.

The property is located 25 minutes from Boise, Idaho, 25 minutes from Kuna, Idaho and 30 minutes from Mountain Home, Idaho which is located south of the area in Elmore County.

The property's location is minutes from the Boise Valley which is centrally located in the Mountain Time Zone and Southwestern Idaho. The Boise Valley provides easy non-stop access to all major cities on the West Coast, the Pacific Northwest and Intermountain West.

The major interstate serving the Boise Valley is I-84, running through the metro area's major cities Boise, Meridian, Nampa, Caldwell, and I-184 branches toward the northeast into downtown Boise. Daily commutes are easy for the Boise Valley's population with federal highways 20, 26, and 30 and state highways 21, 44 and 55 providing access to communities across the Valley.





There are 50 motor freight companies traveling 5 interstates, 20 U.S. highways and 30 state highways that serve the Boise Valley. More than 1,600 miles of rail line through Union Pacific and Burlington Northern Santa Fe provide connection points to Canada, Mexico and the U.S. These rail lines are aided by the State's regional line and 6 short line railroads. Annually, the rail system transports over 11 million tons of freight.
